Michael is a 1969 graduate of Robert R. Moton High School. While attending Moton High School, Michael was First Chair Clarinet player in the Band, Captain of the basketball team, and President of the 1969 graduating class.

From 1971 to 1976 Michael was employed with United Chair Company in Leeds, Alabama. In the Spring of 1976 he became employed at Lehigh Cement Company (Cement Plant) in Leeds, Alabama. While at the Cement Plant, Michael progressed from Laborer to Supervisor of the Service Department. He also worked as a Contract Packer, processor, Relief Supervisor and Quarry Supervisor. Michael was held in high esteem among the workers and management. He was instrumental in hiring many employees areas. Michael retired from Lehigh in 2014, after thirty eight years of outstanding service.

Through the Years, Michael has served the City of Leeds as a member of the Leeds Board of Education, the Civic League, the Leeds Zoning Board, and the Leeds Park and recreation Board. 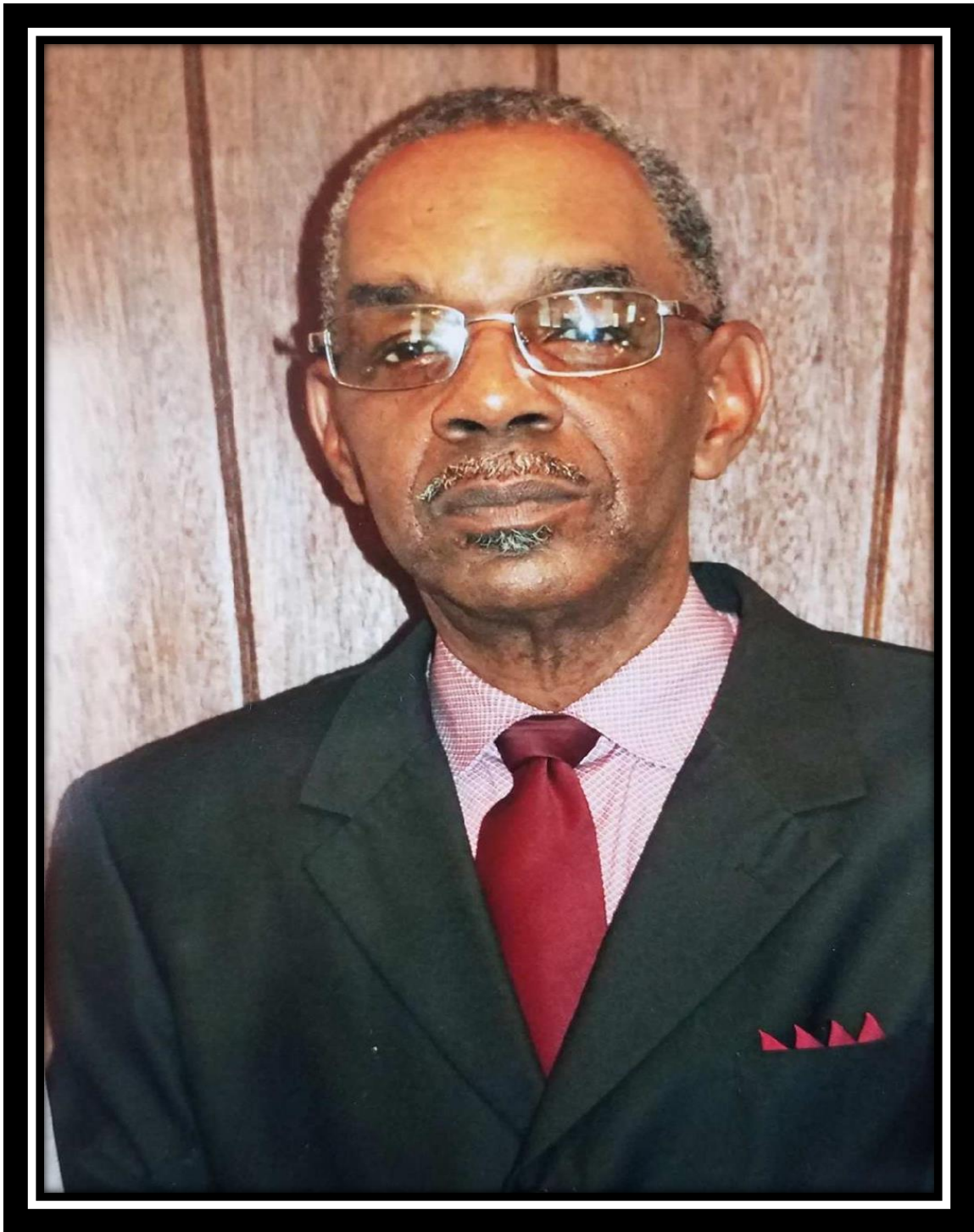
